- Kent Chamber of Commerce honors Kent School District employee Kent Reporter Dave Bilyeu, the Kent School District's director of Career and Technical Education, has been named the Kent Chamber of Commerce Educator of the Year...
- New Skills for Youth Initiative Awards \$2.5 Million in Grants for CTE Nationwide Washington State is
 1 of 24 states and the District of Columbia that will each receive a \$100,000 grant to assess the
 effectiveness and opportunities for growth in their CTE programs as a result of JPMorgan Chase &
 Co.'s New Skills for Youth initiative. The grants are just one component of the broader \$75 million,
 five-year initiative, undertaken in partnership with Advance CTE and the Council of Chief State School
 Officers, which is intended to help expand CTE programs and their capacity to prepare students for
 college-and career-success.

- Wash. aviation high school changes admissions policy to boost diversity Raisbeck Aviation High School in Tukwila, Wash., is an in-demand public school that connects students to aerospace companies and resources from The Museum of Flight. The school has shifted to a lottery system to better capture the area's gender and racial diversity. The Seattle Times (4/3)
- New Western Washington U. president to focus on industry partnerships Sabah Randhawa, the new president of Western Washington University, says his priorities are to expand online courses and forge partnerships with industries to increase opportunities for students. Randhawa previously served as the provost at Ohio State University where he was credited with boosting international student enrollment. The Seattle Times (4/5)
- Why Amazon's robots aren't displacing people Amazon fulfillment centers now boast about 30,000 merchandise-moving Kiva robots and about 230,000 humans who bring skills the machines don't have. "Once you get into more unstructured environments, involving objects with different shape and size and material properties, as well as unpredictable spatial arrangements of multiple objects, it is still cheaper to hire humans," robotics researcher Emanuel Todorov said. - <u>Seattle program aims to train diverse youths in environmentalism</u> A program to spur diversity in environmentalism was launched at an Earth Day 46 event along Seattle's Duwamish River, a Superfund cleanup site. The program aims to introduce youths from diverse backgrounds to environmental jobs and issues. <u>SeattlePI.com</u> (4/22)
- Wash. technical college develops computer science bachelor's degree Renton Technical College will
 offer a bachelor's degree program in computer network architecture beginning in the winter of 2018.
 The program was developed in response to employers' need for workers who can set up and manage
 cloud services and other computer networks. The Seattle Times (4/26)
- Wash. students feed community Puyallup High School's Family, Career and Community Leaders of America chapter has dedicated itself since January to providing gourmet meals plus other food items for food-insecure homes in the community. The chapter estimates it has fed about 2,000 people since starting the project. The News Tribune (Tacoma, Wash.) (5/17)
- <u>Wash. college to revamp culinary education</u> Clark College in Vancouver, Wash., is remodeling its culinary building to feature high-tech facilities for both its cuisine and its professional baking and pastry arts programs. The college also is updating its culinary curriculum to reflect the needs of the industry. <u>The Columbian (Vancouver, Wash.)</u> (5/18)
