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## 1st Annual CTE Showcase of Skills

On March 27, 2017 the Workforce Board, and partners will host the 1st Annual CTE Showcase of Skills.

This event will showcase the skills learned by our career and technical education students across the state, as they come together on Olympia's Capitol Campus to construct 25 transitional shelters!
