A busy week for CTE in the Legislative Session comes to an end today. Testimony for Career and College Ready graduation requirements was heard on Thursday in House Education. The hearing can be viewed on TVW.

I want to thank the health science and physical therapy students who shared their experiences with the committee. There was a great deal of support for greater flexibility to earn credits in the 1656 credit framework. Comments were made by the high school counselors' association and I thank them for their strong support. The majority of all comments referenced the need for additional funding to deliver any 24-credit framework.

Now comes the time for members of the [House Education Committee](#) to hear from their constituents encouraging them to support 1656 and to vote in favor of a "do pass" out of committee to Rules. *(If you will be contacting your House member on this committee be sure to do so on your own time with your own phone and/or computer. DO NOT USE SCHOOL TIME OR EQUIPMENT!)*

It will be important to make those contacts before next Wednesday, 1/29/14 when two bills (2181, 1656, and others in **bold** below) move to possible executive session at the House Education Committee next week. See hearing details below.
