

# WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education

We have now arrived at the halfway point, House of Origin cutoff, in the legislative process. Bills from the House and Senate have to be passed and sent over to the other chamber by Wednesday, February 14 at 5 p.m. marking the third major benchmark in the process.

It cannot be overstated how the pace and volume of bills this session have been as great as any here can remember in recent history for a “short” session. With that said, this first major House of Origin cutoff will reduce the volume of bills that have a chance of “staying alive,” unless the bill is deemed **Necessary to Implement the Budget, known as NTIB**. Now that bills move to the other chamber they have a faster pace to pass out of their assigned Policy committee by February 23.

So where are we on affecting change to the impending change to FTE calculation for CTE in the time remaining in session? Our estimation is that our best opportunity to have a solution to fixing the loss to CTE is by hopefully amending [SB 6362](#) and seeking proviso language within the final supplemental budget. Final supplemental budget bill is in flux, so stay tuned.

When final language is created we will need a Senator and a Representative to lead this through the process. Then we will need everyone’s help and effort to inform legislative leaders to seek their help in moving this through in the time we have left.

In the near future we will be asking you to help by:

- Setup office visits with your legislative members in Olympia to meet with them to share the issue and how it will affect your students, programs, and districts.
  - I will be available to join you in those meetings or help in any way for those coming to Olympia.
  - We strongly suggest you bring an industry partner from your district if possible.
- Email and/or call each of your legislative members asking them to “fix” the CTE funding distribution issue this session in the [SB 6362](#) correction bill along with budget proviso language.

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## **HOUSE BILLS**

### [House Bill 1600: Increasing the career and college readiness of public school students](#)

The amendment removes the "subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this specific purpose" clause for provisions establishing the work-integrated learning initiative. (2) Authorizes the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction (rather than requiring it, subject to funding) to contract with a statewide nonprofit organization to establish a grant program to fund actions of schools participating in the work-integrated learning initiative. (3) Removes specific interim and end-of-project reporting dates for schools participating in the work-integrated learning initiative. (4) Increases the duties of the Work-Integrated Learning Advisory Committee proposed in the underlying bill by requiring it to review the instructional programs of projects funded through the Career Connect Washington Program with grant moneys from the federal Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act that are related to work- integrated learning. (5) Establishes specific requirements for the review of instructional programs by the Work-Integrated Learning Advisory Committee. (6) Removes proposed provisions requiring an analysis of specified data by the Center for the Improvement of Student Learning and the Washington State Institute for Public Policy. (7) Directs the Work-Integrated Learning Advisory Committee to, as appropriate, work collaboratively with the Expanded Learning Opportunities Advisory Council as provided in ESHB 2802 (concerning expanded learning opportunities).

### [House Bill 1827: Expanding the current and future educator workforce supply through evidence-based strategies to improve and incentivize the recruitment and retention of highly effective educators](#)

The amendment eliminates the restriction that retired members of the Teachers' Retirement Systems Plan 2 and 3 eligible for enhanced postretirement employment be eligible only if employed in an instructional capacity, and only if the school district compensates substitute teachers at a rate of at least 85 percent of the state allocation, and replaces it with a restriction that requires only that the retired teacher be reemployed in a non-administrative position. A similar postretirement employment enhancement is created for retired classified school employees in the School Employees' Retirement System.

### [House Bill 2009: Providing higher education support for gold star families](#)

The amendment removes the null and void clause.

### [House Bill 2177: Creating the rural county high employer demand jobs program](#)

The amendment includes in the definition of "eligible county" any county that shares a common border with Canada and has a population of over 125,000.

### [House Bill 2684: Defining the process for best interest determinations of students in out-of-home care](#)

The amendment removes a provision in the proposed protocols for making best interest determinations for students in out-of-home care specifying that best interest determinations may consider transportation costs, but transportation cost considerations may not be prioritized over the needs of the student.

### [House Bill 2700: Concerning the handling of child forensic interview and child interview digital recordings](#)

The amendment replaces the term child forensic "digital recordings" with the term child forensic "audio and video recordings" to be consistent with the terminology used in other sections of the bill.

### [House Bill 2730: Encouraging employers to promote and support workers' educational attainment](#)

Substitute provides a business and occupation and public utility tax credit for contributions to qualified educational expenses of employees, of up to \$5,000 annually per eligible employee.

[House Bill 2802: Concerning expanded learning opportunities](#)

The amendment (1) Expires the Expanded Learning Opportunities Advisory Council (Council) on June 30, 2021. (2) Requires the Council's annual report to include a gap analysis that identifies, at the school district level, where expanded learning opportunity gaps exist for certain student populations, school districts, or both, and whether the provision of additional expanded learning opportunities would enhance student academic achievement.

[House Bill 2855: Concerning the sharing of information between participants in multidisciplinary coordination of child sexual abuse investigations](#)

Substitute authorizes participants in the multidisciplinary coordination of child sexual abuse investigations are authorized to share information about criminal child sexual investigations and case planning following such investigations with other participants in the multidisciplinary coordination.

[House Bill 2985: Enhancing educational opportunities for vulnerable youth using funding distributed from the Puget Sound taxpayer accountability account](#)

Introduced by Rep. Ruth Kagi (Lake Forest Park) (D)

**SENATE BILLS**

[Senate Bill 6065: Adopting policy and procedures on student interviews and interrogations](#)

The amendment states that if a student is 12 and older, parent contact before an interview or interrogation is not required when the law enforcement officer has a warrant, court order, or indicates that exigent circumstances exist. (2) Provides that law enforcement officers do not have to recognize the potential time delay for parents or guardians to be contacted and a reasonable time for them to arrive when exigent circumstances apply. (3) Provides that if a student is 18 to 21, the principal or designee is not required to contact the parents or guardians before an interview or interrogation. (4) Provides a definition for exigent circumstances to mean circumstances that include, but are not limited to, serious threats to the health and safety of students and staff.

[Senate Bill 6246: Providing for approval of school district bonds by fifty-five percent of the voters voting](#)

Substitute lowers voter approval threshold to 55 percent for school districts to issue general obligation capital bonds, levy taxes to pay off the bonds.

[Senate Bill 6257: Providing early intervention services for eligible children](#)

Substitute provides that the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) must oversee the provision of early intervention services for children with disabilities from birth through two years of age. The amendment passed (1) Removes sections of the bill that addressed school districts' provision of early intervention services, directed public entities who are billing Medicaid to provide early intervention services to bill private insurance as soon as practicable, and changed the terminology from "birth to three" to "birth through two." (2) Retains the section that directs certain agencies to develop a funding model for early intervention services for children with disabilities from birth through two years of age. (3) Adds that the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) must seek the advice and assistance from the State Interagency Coordinating Council and states that DCYF oversees early intervention services.

[Senate Bill 6410: Concerning school safety](#)

Substitute offered in the Senate on February 1, 2018

Requires first responder agencies to notify all schools in the vicinity, including private schools, if there is a situation for which an evacuation or lockdown appears reasonably necessary.

[Senate Bill 6419: Concerning access to the Washington early childhood education and assistance program](#)

Substitute directs the Department of Children, Youth, and Families (DCYF) to adopt rules that allow children whose families do not meet income eligibility requirements but are homeless or impacted by certain risk factors to be included in the Early Childhood Education and Assistance Program (ECEAP) on a space available basis.

[Senate Bill 6460: Concerning student access to school libraries and information technology](#)

Substitute requires the Office of Superintendent for Public Instruction (OSPI) to examine and report on student access to school library information and technology resources.

[Senate Bill 6474: Creating a pilot project for tribal compact schools](#)

Substitute creates a pilot project for Tribal Compact Schools to explore and implement options with respect to: school attendance and calendar requirements; accommodating cultural and agricultural events; and replacing graduating testing requirements with culturally relevant and community-based standards.

[Senate Bill 6571: Providing a sales and use tax exemption for agricultural education students](#)

Substitute provides a sales tax exemption for livestock, feed, veterinary services, medicines, and supplies purchased by an agricultural education student to be used in conjunction with a junior livestock show.

[Senate Bill 6593: Relating to higher education](#)

Introduced by Sen. Kevin Ranker (Orcas Island) (D)  
Title Only bill.

[Senate Bill 6608: Relating to education](#)

Introduced by Sen. Lisa Wellman (Mercer Island) (D)  
Title Only Bill.

February 14, 2018	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
February 23, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 26, 2018	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 2, 2018*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 8, 2018	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
