The halfway mark...

Bills still "alive and well" continue to shrink after Tuesday's deadline for bills with a fiscal impact to pass out of budget committees. While most bills will remain in the "dead" status, which means they are done for the session, others could be labeled "Necessary To Implement the Budget" – or NTIB – allowing them to remain in play once budget bills start to appear.

The next big deadline is 5 p.m. on February 18 when all bills must have passed the chamber (House or Senate) in which they started. Also next week, lawmakers will be watching for the February 20 revenue forecast; the rumor is that revenues will be up by about \$150 million, which provides a bit of cushion for pet projects that require new money, but would require a supplemental budget.

As a result of the positive revenue forecast, this will be the first year that the legislature will not be required to create a supplemental budget in over 7 years. Now the leadership from both chambers must decide if they "want" to create a supplemental budget and how limited it will be. The senate continues to say they will not. Next week should bring some clarity to the conversation...stay tuned.

Some bills still in play for CTE are...

The Washington ACTE has continually been focused on ensuring flexibility within any 24-credit framework that is easily understood by both students and parents and is easily delivered by school districts.

With the passage of [E2SSB 6552](#) Thursday evening by a vote of [45 to 4](#) in the Senate we again are seeking that clarity and intention for the flexibility when a 24-credit framework is finally implemented.

To do so we are off working with members in the House for consideration of possible amendments to achieve this intention and clarity within the State Board of Education's January 9, 2014, Career and College Graduation Requirement resolution.

As passed [E2SSB 6552](#) would make the following changes:

- Decrease the requirement for 1,080 instructional hours from grades 7-12 to grades 9-12;
- Allow for a district-wide averaging of instructional hours for purposes of basic education apportionment;
- Authorize a 24-credit framework for the class of 2019, as adopted by the State Board of Education on January 9, 2014;
- Require district boards of directors to grant academic credit for math and science CTE courses, starting in the 2015-2016 school year; and
- Redirect the \$97 million appropriated in the 2013-2015 operating budget for the 1,080 hours to be used for an additional \$130 per student in MSOC in grades 9-12, additional high school guidance counselors, and reduced lab science classroom space.

This, again, would be a great topic or question to ask at a local town hall meeting (see details below).

- [SB 6061](#) (Still in Senate Rules) would require school districts, starting in the 2014-2015 school year, to adopt a policy by which high school students who pass a statewide assessment would be automatically enrolled in the next most rigorous course offered at the high school. A bill that allowed districts to adopt or modify WSSDA’s model policy passed last session and is being implemented in a permissive way. This bill would mandate all districts with a high school use the automatic enrollment approach. There is an amendment; on page 1, line 8, after "section." insert "Any academic acceleration policy adopted by a school district board of directors must require parents and students to opt into participating in the academic acceleration program."
- [SSB 6121](#) would specify that ALE online courses will be funded based on the estimated statewide annual average allocation per student FTE in grades 9-12, excluding small school enhancements, and would specify that ALE remote or onsite CTE courses that require specialized equipment or training could receive an enhanced funding rate as determined by OSPI.

Meet your legislator directly back home:

February 22 is the Saturday that most legislators will be back in their districts holding “Session Town Hall” events. This is a great opportunity to meet your legislators without having to make the trip to Olympia and share your thoughts about what is currently happening during this session.

Two key questions to ask related to CTE issues would be:

- **“Are they aware of the need for a technical fix to CTE funding as outlined by OSPI?” If not, briefly share the disconnect from basic education funding and the importance of having that funding in your local districts. Either way the member(s) will become aware and/or share their thoughts.**
- **“Are they willing to ensure flexibility for students and parents within the State Board of Education’s January 9, 2014, Career and College Graduation Requirements resolution with possible amendments to PSSB-6552?” (Note: those amendments will likely be clear on the 22nd)**
