Career and Technical Education (CTE) Bills this week:

Senate Bill 5183 & House Bill 1282:

SB 5183 has been passed by the Early Learning & K-12 Education (ELK12) Committee to Ways & Means, without amendments. We will continue to offer the following suggestions for their consideration in amending the bill related to Allowable Expenditures for CTE funding enhancement:

- Materials, equipment, and supplies for CTE programs
- CTE staff salaries limited to the state salary allocation and extended learning activities and contracts connected to CTE program delivery. Stay tuned.

HB 1282 is scheduled for Appropriations on 2/20 @ 1:30 PM in House Hearing Room A of the John L. O'Brien Building (not scheduled for executive session at this time).

House Bill 1509: This bill will provide an opportunity for students to complete all credits required for high school graduation by reducing the total number of credits required from 24 to 21. This bill was passed by the House Education committee, most likely to the Appropriations committee where it will be determined if the bill moves to the House floor for final consideration. As with all bills, if passed off the floor of the House it moves over to the Senate for a repeat of the process.

Senate Bill 5758 & House Bill 2075: These are new bills "dropped" last week and SB 5758 had a public hearing in ELK12 and was passed on to Ways & Means yesterday. The bill requires the Legislature to allocate an additional \$400 per annual average full-time equivalent student enrolled in middle and high schools; this amount must be adjusted annually for inflation. And, directs school districts that qualify for the additional funding to establish or expand each of the following three programs: (1) Career and Technical Education (CTE) in middle and high schools, and skill centers; (2) college-level courses in high schools; and (3) dropout prevention strategies in high schools.

Next week the action should take a brief pause as the chambers take up more floor action to move bills over to the other chamber and committees redistribute the bills they have passed on to the "money" committees or Rules. But there will never be a dull moment, so stay tuned!

February 24, 2017

Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.

March 8, 2017

Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).

March 29, 2017

Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.

April 4, 2017

Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.

April 12, 2017*

Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
