Today is the 50th day of the 2018 Legislative Session. With only 10 days remaining a lot has been done and the coming days will be a sprint to the final countdown to Sine Die on March 8. This week has been busy with the House and Senate releasing both their supplemental operating and capital budget proposals and policy committees scrambling to hear and act on bills before the final policy cutoff that occurred Friday, February 23.

With regard to the budgets, it is important to remember that supplemental budgets are meant to address gaps in the two-year budget adopted in the previous legislative session(s). This is where we are working to address the CTE FTE calculation reduction that begins this fall for the 2018-2019 school year. Information can be found on our website where you will find a one-pager on the issue and the language we are seeking. The latest version ([CTE Proviso Ask](#)) is an improvement on the language we hope to have both chambers and caucuses agree to through the reconciliation process of both budget bills. If you are speaking to your legislative members on this topic we ask that you use the latest version and let me know if you get any response(s).

HOUSE BILLS

[House Bill 1508: Promoting student health and readiness through meal and nutrition programs](#)
Passed 87 to 8 in the House on February 19, 2018. House concurred in Senate Amendments.

[House Bill 2266: Clarifying the nature of the driver training education curriculum developed and maintained by the department of licensing and the office of the superintendent of public instruction](#)
Amendment offered: Provides a definition of core curriculum as the curriculum that: (1) Is developed and maintained by OSPI and DOL; (2) Must be taught in approved driver education courses; and (3) Contains standards that must be completed to complete the course.

[House Bill 2700: Concerning the handling of child forensic interview and child interview digital recordings](#)
Amendment offered: Requires advance notice to a child who is an emancipated minor or has attained the age of majority before the court ordered disclosure of any audio or video recording of a child forensic interview involving the child.

SENATE BILLS

[Senate Bill 6614: Concerning funding for the support of common schools](#)
Introduced by Sen. Mark Mullet (Issaquah) (D) on February 19, 2018
Substitute offered: Reduces the calendar year 2018 state property tax by \$431 million. Transfers \$431 million from the budget stabilization account to the state general fund (GFS) for the support of common schools.

February 26, 2018	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 2, 2018*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 8, 2018	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
* After the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.
