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Final WOVE 2019 with Education Budget Summary:

The 2019 session ended on time and we have a final operating budget for the 2019-2021 biennium.

A special thanks to those of you who had students and community members that reached out to make contact with legislative members. The feedback shared with me was outstanding. It makes our job so much easier when a Senator or Representative starts a conversation by saying, "I have heard from folks back in my district about CTE." This means we have their attention and they are looking for ways to support CTE.

We will be sharing legislative details at [Summer Conference](#) and providing an "Advocacy 101" for everyone to learn of ways to engage our lawmakers year-round to educate them about CTE's importance in the lives of our students and their future success in our society.

This year we were able to "drop" two bills ([HB 1891](#) and [SB 5803](#)) to address and improve upon our concerns in the use of enhanced CTE resources. While we failed to have either bill pass this session we are still in the "que" for the short session in January 2020.

Going forward we need you to join us in the planning and implementation of an advocacy plan that will strengthen our success and support for CTE going forward.
