

WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education

2019 Legislative Session | February 11, 2019

WOVE...Representing the Career and Technical Education field through advocacy activities, which promotes the value of CTE and the policies that are needed to support CTE practitioners, advance the field, and improve student learning.
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I hope you all are doing well in the second round of the winter blast hitting the Puget Sound and Northwest! The challenge with the State Legislature is that there are no “snow-days”! I will be in Olympia and on the hill doing what I can, but I will need your help from home!

This becomes important for CTE this week as we have a hearing scheduled for Wednesday at 3:30 PM in the House Appropriations Committee in House Hearing Room A for [HB 1891](#). With the pending snow and not knowing how travel will be we have our “fingers-crossed” for those planning to join us to testify on the bill. All of us can still have an impact by directly emailing [Appropriation Committee members](#) between now and the hearing. Please do so on your own time using your own resources. (DO NOT – use work time, computers, email, and district servers). We have also received word that [SB 5803](#) will be having a hearing in Senate Early Learning & K-12 Committee soon–stay tuned. We have asked for a substitute bill to get the same language in front of both committees.

If you're interested in being engaged in making this happen and to help our work on our CTE Resources bills, please join us for our weekly GoToMeetings every Thursday at 6 PM–just let me know and I will make sure you have the details to join us. This week we should be talking on what is needed to move [HB 1891](#) forward in committee. After a bill has a public hearing in any committee the next step is to have the committee agree to “Exec” the bill out of committee. The chair of the committee is critical in making this happen for our [HB 1891](#) in Appropriations. If any of you are in Chairman Ormsby's [3rd Legislative District](#) please consider reaching out and thank him for hearing the bill on Wednesday, then ask him to exec the bill as soon as possible out of committee after Wednesday's hearing. This is critical to have happen before the March 1 cutoff date for Fiscal Committee(s).

Taking Action

Hopefully you are engaged in actions to support our CTE advocacy efforts, so here are some actions you may consider taking.

Always remember to advocate on your own time and only using your personal email. Never use work resources to be assured that you do not violate PDC laws as a public employee.

- Review the week ahead committee meeting schedule, focusing on bills that have been scheduled for public hearing. [HB 1891](#) is scheduled for Wednesday and contact your legislators asking them to support our two CTE bills–especially if they serve on one of the key committees.
- Reach out with your perspective on the bill and share your story. Consider coming to Olympia to meet with your member and testify on a bill important to you.
- Share CTE program data from your school/district, stories, and suggestions to improve the proposed policy from your prospective is important to legislators. *You are the expert for your program and the needs of your students so don't be anxious to share your story.*
- Follow-up with legislators/committees on a specific bill or issue.
- Provide input on bills not yet scheduled for hearings that are an issue, area of interest, or concern to you. Specifically, for CTE share your thoughts on [HB 1891](#) and [SB 5803](#).

SESSION CUTOFF CALENDAR

February 22, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) in house of origin, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 1, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.
March 13, 2019	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
April 3, 2019	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 9, 2019	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
April 17, 2019*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
April 28, 2019	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.
* After the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.	

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
