WOVE Legislative Update for Career and Technical Education



2018 Legislative Session | January 8, 2018

WOVE...Representing the Career and Technical Education field through advocacy activities, which promotes the value of CTE and the policies that are needed to support CTE practitioners, advance the field, and improve student learning.

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Today marks the first day of the 2018 Legislative Session. After the long six months of last session, this year's short 60 days will move quickly. Despite fatigue in Olympia from the McCleary debate, the conversation about education is not over.

Our <u>2018 legislative priorities</u> are focused on making sure that new money for CTE is finding its way to CTE programs, the value of CTE in delivering meaningful career connected learning in Washington, and providing resources for statewide student leadership activities.

During the first four weeks of session bills will move fast. After introduction, we expect hearings to be scheduled in the education committees. After the hearing and readings of the bill, the committee needs to vote to send it to the floor by **no later than February 2** (the first cutoff date for bills in their House of Origin). It then goes to the Fiscal Committee by February 6 and, if all goes well, is voted on and sent to the other chamber by February 14

Hearings are already scheduled in education committees this week. Here are a few highlights about what we're watching:

In the Senate Early Learning & K-12 Education Committee:

- A working session on 1/9 will discuss the impact of <u>EHB 2242</u> and how to improve in the following policy areas:
 - School district levies
 - Special education funding

In the House Education Committee:

• A public hearing on 1/9 for <u>ESHB 1600</u> - Increasing the career and college readiness of public school students. (If measure is referred to committee.)

January 8, 2018	First Day of Session
February 2, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) in house of origin, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 6, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees in house of origin.
February 14, 2018	Last day to consider (pass) bills in house of origin (5 p.m.).
February 23, 2018	Last day to read in committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from opposite house, except House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
February 26, 2018	Last day to read in opposite house committee reports (pass bills out of committee and read them into the record on the floor) from House fiscal committees and Senate Ways & Means and Transportation committees.
March 2, 2018*	Last day to consider (pass) opposite house bills (5 p.m.) (except initiatives and alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session).
March 8, 2018	Last day allowed for regular session under state constitution.

^{*} After the 54th day, only initiatives, alternatives to initiatives, budgets and matters necessary to implement budgets, matters that affect state revenue, messages pertaining to amendments, differences between the houses, and matters incident to the interim and closing of the session may be considered.
