The most important criteria will be the candidate's Letter of Interest, their Statement of Issues, and their ability to provide the documentation of support from their local administration. Once the selection process is complete, new members will begin their training with an inservice session for the purpose of preparing them for the activities they will participate in as Fellows. This initial in-service will be offered during our annual WA-ACTE Fall Conference.

Fellowship Criteria

Fellowships are limited to current WA-ACTE Members who have at least one year of work directly related to Career and Technical Education. A Fellowship requires a twoyear commitment from the applicant and their support institution through the Director and Principal.. Applicants must submit a complete Online Fellowship Application containing **all** of the following documents by the designated due date in order to be considered for the Fellowship Program.

Program Goals

- Learn and develop methods in creating and facilitating CTE courses and sessions for further professional development.

- Learn ways to connect with industry leaders and form partnerships involving CTE related programs and courses.
- Communicate and brainstorm with your Fellows' class in developing service learning and action research projects.
- Develop a knowledge base of CTE legislation and CTE program related statistics to share with your school district, legislators, and stakeholders.

- Develop and complete an online portfolio highlighting your fellowship experiences. (**Required**).
- Serve on a WA-ACTE committee.
- Pursue leadership positions within your affiliate association and WA-ACTE.

- Interview local representatives/senators?

As you engage in the Fellowship experience you will have the assistance of your Fellows' class, a Fellow mentor and your Fellowship Program coordinator.
