Wash. students gain operator skills with sandbox training

Napavine High School in Washington has introduced "The Tiger Sandbox," a hands-on training area where students learn to operate heavy equipment such as tractors. The project allows students to develop basic operator skills in a controlled environment, which are essential for exploring career opportunities in construction and related fields.

Wash. leads US in year-over-year construction job gains

Washington State led US states and the District of Columbia with 4,000 jobs added between December 2023 and December 2024, according to the Associated General Contractors. However, industry advocates express concern about potential impacts from federal decisions, including funding pauses and changes to work authorization. "Many firms are counting on strong public-sector demand this year and plan to hire as a result," says AGC CEO Jeffrey Shoaf. "But possible federal funding pauses and efforts to curtail lawful work authorizations could impact future hiring plans for many firms."

Mobile classroom brings trade skills to students

Centralia College in Washington state has introduced a Career and Technical Education mobile classroom to Lewis County schools, offering students hands-on experience in trades such as welding and electrical repair. The initiative aims to spark interest in trades among younger students and has been supported by a \$1.3 million grant from TransAlta.

WAVE award launches, help spread the word to CTE students

The <u>Washington Award for Vocational Excellence</u> (WAVE) scholarship application is open for 2025! The award recognizes high-performing Career and Technical Education (CTE) students at both the high school and community-and-technical college level. Many factors determine awards, including appropriated funding from the state Legislature and where students go to school. At a minimum, students will receive about \$3,900 per year, for two years, or \$7,800 total. WAVE is administered by the Workforce Board in collaboration with the Washington Student Achievement Council, which handles the disbursement of funds. The application deadline is March 10.

Public comment open for Perkins State Determined Performance Levels

Now is the chance to weigh in on <u>2026 performance indicators</u> as part of the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Act, a federal plan that addresses Career and Technical Education (CTE) at both the high school and postsecondary levels. States are required to set and report on core indicators of performance, including the graduation rate of CTE students, along with academic proficiency in reading, math and science, among other categories.
