## **WORKFORCE BOARD ANNOUNCES WAVE SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS**

Students who applied for the Washington Award for Vocational Excellence (WAVE) scholarship were notified by email last week about whether they received this popular award that celebrates career and technical education and the value of real-world, hands-on learning. Some 121 students from across Washington were selected for the 2024 award, representing 47 legislative districts. Among the winners: 86 graduating high school seniors and 35 community and technical college students. This merit-based award pays up to \$6,768 per year, for up to two years.
